The Power of Unity

The body of Christ is unique, set apart as Christ's church within a broken world. As His Church, we are blessed to enjoy the bond of brothers and sisters united in our calling to glorify Jesus Christ with our lives and testimonies. Over the last two years, as we've faced challenges related to political uncertainty, the news of civil unrest, and COVID, my prayer has been that the Lord would strengthen the bond that unites us in Christ, both at HCA and around the world. But does unity among Christ's Church really matter? It certainly does to Jesus. In John 17:20-23, while praying Jesus asks (v. 23), "that they [believers] may be brought to complete unity. Then the world will know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me."

Unity doesn't mean that we are in complete agreement on every aspect of life. As we learn from Paul, there is room in the Church for Christian freedom and matters of conscience. What this means is that, despite differences of opinions in non-essentials, we remain united in Christ. When the world hurls insults and hates those

As Christians, our beliefs are based on the authoritative, inerrant, sufficient Word of God. We are followers of Christ first! All other aspects of life and thought are subject to that calling. Here at HCA, as long as our beliefs and practices do not contradict the Bible, we are not divided. Instead, we celebrate unity as Christians who are diverse in ethnicity, race, customs, thoughts, and political preferences, but one in Christ.

The peace that comes with unity is a great blessing for Christians. But, let us not forget the ultimate goal of a unified school and Church; that the world will know that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, sent by the loving Father, to a world in need. May HCA be a place where we are united in Christ. May the unity of Christ be evident in our relationships, interactions, words, and conduct. And may our unity glorify God and point to Jesus Christ as the Son of God and hope for the hopeless in a weary and divided world.

A Legacy Perspective

As HCA graduates, why did you send your children to HCA?

HCA has been an important part of our lives since the 1980s. We both graduated from HCA in 1991, and when it came time to find a school for our own children, we did not consider any other options. We felt it was important for them to be educated in an environment that is centered around Christ, with a curriculum that supports a Biblical worldview. We wanted their peers and classmates to be grounded in that same worldview, and we wanted their teachers to care, not only about their social and intellectual development, but about their spiritual development as well, modeling for them what it means to love others as a follower of Christ. We felt that an education without these things would not be a complete education. Because if God is truly the foundation of all things, then an education without Him at the center is missing a lot of truth. We want our children to learn the whole truth, not just part of it, and HCA provides that for them, building in them a strong foundation from which we pray they will grow into who God ultimately wants them to be.



Mrs. Erica Marota KINDERGARTEN TEACHER




High School Cross Country

The High School Cross Country program continued where it left off last season and hit the ground running. The Varsity Girls team matched their success from the 2020 season and earned 2nd place overall in the NJIC Patriot Division. The 2nd place finish earned them a spot in the inaugural NJIC Conference XC Championship Meet. This was a great honor for the Defenders and the direct result from their training and discipline. Seven Defenders received All League and/or All County post-season recognition and Coach Chi Chi Van Dyk was voted as the NJIC Patriot Division Cross Country Coach of the Year! Coach Chi Chi was recognized as the unanimous recipient of this notable distinction.



Varsity Boys Soccer

Despite a difficult first two games, the Varsity Boys Soccer team made some in-season adjustments in a very difficult league and earned their eleventh consecutive NJSIAA State Tournament. Students dig deeply into college-level vocal repertoire, doing research, writing essays, and then performing the five songs that they have prepared for a panel of professionals. Participants are required to prepare an Italian song from the 17th-18th century, an art song in another foreign language, a 20th-21st century American/English art song, a musical theater song or operatic aria, and another song of their choice. As students explore this music, they study vocal technique, diction, music history, music theory, artistic expression, and performance





technique. The juries for the Fall 2021 semester were held in late January, and the panel of judges included a vocal coach/accompanist from Montclair State University, a singer from the Metropolitan Opera, and a local operatic professional, who each gave feedback, suggestions, and encouragement to the students. This experience helps prepare students for college auditions and experiences, and challenges them to cultivate their God-given talents!


