

In 586 BC, the Babylonians invaded Jerusalem. They burned the temple, the royal palace and other buildings, broke down the walls, killed many and carried off the rest into captivity (2 Kings 25). Over a century later, the city still laid in ruins.

The book of Nehemiah tells the amazing story of how God, in the midst of despair, raised up a man, Nehemiah, who would lead the rebuilding of the wall. Through answered prayer and God's provision, the work began, despite many obstacles and opposition. People from all occupations were involved, and "the people worked with all their hearts" (Nehemiah 3, 4:6). However, as the work progressed, challenges and resistance increased. With steadfast focus. Nehemiah resisted the temptation to stop building and responded, "I am carrying on a great project and cannot go down" (Nehemiah 6:4). Remarkably, the wall was completed in 52 days. Nehemiah commented that it was a testimony of God's grace to the surrounding nations "because they realized that this work had been done with the help of our God" (Nehemiah 6:16).

As we celebrate our 40th anniversary as an Academy, we too can look back at the wonderful blessings and see that the "work has been done with the help of our God!" Having been here since the beginning of Hawthorne Christian Academy, I have a unique perspective of the blessing we have seen over the years. Starting a Christian school certainly was not easy, and we, as the people of Judah, faced many obstacles and challenges. Our motivation from the very beginning was our vision to teach children from a Biblical perspective, equipping them to become fully devoted followers of Christ.

As we continually committed our vision to prayer, we sensed God's leading, saw His provision, and as a result, our HCA began in 1981.

Thankfully, just as in Nehemiah's day, God raised

up many wonderful, godly, dedicated people for the task, many of whom are with the Lord today. Precious people who selflessly gave their time, energy, and resources because they were "carrying on a great project," serving the Lord, and were determined to keep going despite the hurdles. Others became excited about what God was doing and joined in, pouring their time, energy and resources into the task. Many served on our Academy Committee and along with others, selflessly gave of themselves, working "with all their hearts," serving the Lord.

Undoubtedly, a primary reason for the continued success of our school is God's provision of our teachers, leaders, and staff. Those involved in education know that a school can only be as good as the teachers and staff. Christ-like, dedicated, enthusiastic, committed, and precious are words that come to my mind as I reflect on our current and past teachers, leaders, and staff. Inspired by our vision, they have always poured themselves into the task, loving our students, giving of themselves, motivated by the ultimate privilege of serving the Lord Jesus Christ. Throughout the years, I have seen the same steadfastness and earnestness, persistence, and determination evident in Nehemiah's day in the lives of many who have had a part of this special work of God. These are the special people that make Hawthorne Christian Academy shine!

Admittedly, in the beginning, there was great concern about the large amount of resources needed to begin and sustain a Christian school, but God's people stepped out in faith. In addition to the facilities and daily needs of our Academy, our church has also continuously provided for all of the ongoing maintenance on the buildings (upkeep, repairs, cleaning, heating, cooling, etc.). As I look at our campus with all the beautiful buildings and field, I am in awe of God's provision through His people over the years.

"Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it." Proverbs 22:6

Building has never stopped over the past 40 years, which has required planning, energy, dedication, and great resources. I am rejoicing that just last year, for the first time in 40 years, all our building debt has been paid in full! The predominate thing that stands out over all the years is God's incredible faithfulness in providing our needs through His people.

God's Word says, "...whoever sows generously will also reap generously..." (2 Corinthians 9:6). Sincere thanks, from the bottom of my heart, for all God's people who have been so big-hearted, who have sown so generously. As a result, we have reaped generously of God's abundant blessing. **The fruit: Children, young people, and adults who know Jesus and love Him!** Brothers and sisters in Christ who know God's Word and are growing in Him! Graduates who love Jesus and desire to be fully devoted followers of Him. And as in Nehemiah's day, we

"...realized that this work has been done with the help of our God" (Nehemiah 6:16).

Thankful for the past, we look ahead to the future! In the days ahead, we will need even greater resources and more people who will devote themselves to the task of serving the Lord. However, if we remain faithful to Him and His Word, we can be assured that our mighty God who has provided for all our needs in the past will continue to do so in the days ahead.

The future will provide wonderful opportunities to serve and glorify God and to see the fruit of people who know, love, and serve Him. Many years before the Academy began, among members of our church family that are mostly all with Jesus, attention was drawn to these special words that still reflect our future perspective:

"God has yet greater things for His people."

Worldview Matters!

You've probably heard HCA faculty and families say, "HCA teaches students through a Biblical Worldview." You may have thought, "Well, it has the word 'Biblical' so it must be good." You're right, it is good! But what is a worldview? Simply stated, a person's worldview is what one believes that influences how one lives. Everyone has a worldview that influences how they view the world and make day-to-day decisions about what to believe, say, and do. There are many worldviews, but only one that is built on truth.

At HCA we know that the Bible is inerrant, authoritative, and sufficient and therefore should be the foundation of how we live as Christians. As such, our goal is to teach that the Bible is true, trustworthy, and the authority on life. We teach the Bible in order to shape beliefs and to equip students to apply God's Word to their life for the good of others and the glory of God! This is the heart of a Biblical Worldview.

Unfortunately, our childrens' worldview is under attack. The world is hopeless, lost, and confused. So much so that the Barna group research on worldview demonstrated that

88% of Americans shared a worldview comprised of an amalgamation of different religions, cultures, and schools of thought. Barna calls this syncretism. The Bible says that the way to combat this confusion is to be "built up until we all reach the unity of faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God." Ephesians continues, "Then we will no longer be infants, tossed back and forth by the waves, and blown here and there by every wind of teaching and by the cunning and craftiness of people in their deceitful scheming."

Here are some tips to foster a Biblical Worldview in your home: 1) Read your Bible everyday, 2) Teach your child to read the Bible and read it with them, 3) Ask, "What does the Bible say about that?" 4) Use the Bible to point out the errors of other worldviews, and 5) Model a life built on the Bible. May the Lord soften the hearts of our children to know and live the truth that is only found in His Holy Word.




High School Track & Field


