We have partnered with Handfuls of Hope (HoH), a ministry that brings the gospel and shows Christ's

love through their work in and around Santo Domingo. HoH serves this area through operating a Christian school, running outreach programs for children, partnering with groups like Outreach Aid to the Americas and One More Child, and distributing Bibles and food (partnering with Feed My Starving Children) through village ministry.

As HoH president Don Coords says, "HoH is a here (pointing to his heart) and there (referring to the DR) ministry." The goal is not only to impact those in the DR, but also to impact the hearts and communities of those who are changed by serving Jesus through these trips. Our prayer is that our students will grow in the following ways:

- Understand God's global work through the people, cultures, and stories they encounter
- Develop their trust in God's sovereignty through a novel and potentially uncomfortable experience
- Be unified with their classmates through their outward focus and common purpose of sharing the light of Christ to the world
- Allow the Holy Spirit to work in and through them, resulting in a new or deeper relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ
- Develop a burden to serve Christ through their influence in their school and community

Don will be joining us as the Keynote Speaker at the 2023 Annual HCA Banquet. We hope you will join us to learn more about this terrific partnership, and we ask for your prayers as we embark on this new endeavor, striving to lead our students and those they serve to "Know Jesus, Know Truth!"





This past fall season for HCA Athletics was another successful one! We had 15 Defenders receive NJIC All League recognition; 12 received PCCA All County awards and 2 Defenders earned SCANJ All State honors. The Varsity Boys Soccer team, the Varsity Girls Soccer team, and the Varsity Girls Volleyball team all earned 1st round home games in their respective PCCA County Tournaments, and all three teams won in front of the home crowds! All of those three Varsity teams also won in front of the Defender faithful during HCA's Annual Homecoming.

The Varsity Boys Soccer team had a very thrilling golden goal overtime win in the State Tournament. As the High School Cross Country program continues to grow, we were very excited that two newcomers, sophomores Cole Higby and Isaac Lee, were both All League and All County and

earned qualification in the NJSIAA State Championship Meet. The Varsity Girls Volleyball team finished the season with 14 wins, which is one of the highest win totals in program history for a single season.

Both the Middle School Boys and the Middle School Girls Soccer teams advanced to the Finals of the Annual Coppa Italia Soccer Tournament. Our Middle School Lady Defenders won the entire tournament! And after two scoreless overtime periods, the Middle School Boys suffered a heartbreaking loss in a penalty kick shootout. The participation numbers across the board for both our High School and Middle School athletic teams are up and that is very promising for the future. Our fan support for not only home games but also away games continues to be strong, for which we are extremely grateful.

A Wonderful "Opera-tunity!"

The annual New Jersey All State Opera Festival provides the opportunity for students across New Jersey to experience the world of opera through excellence in performance, creativity, and education, stimulating them to develop an appreciation for opera and to achieve their highest potential in vocal performance. The festival returned in virtual form this year after a hiatus due to Covid. Students from across the state submitted videos of operatic arias and ensemble performances for adjudication by former operatic stars, Ronald Naldi and Louis Otey. These students received scores, feedback, and some wonderful swag from The Metropolitan Opera. Participating HCA students received high accolades for their submissions. HCA sophomore Cecilia Soheily received 1st runner up in the solo category for her aria from Mozart's Cosi fan tutte, and seniors Tyler Kriney and Luke Mitchell received the Madame Paunova Small Ensemble Award for their highest scoring duet from the Gilbert and Sullivan The Gondoliers.

Six were selected for the Mixed Chorus in Atlantic City on November 9-11. 


